What is NCQA's SPD Measure?

- The SPD measure monitors the percentage of members 40-75 years of age during the measurement period with Diabetes who do not have clinical atherosclerotic cardiovascular disease (ASCVD) who:
 - Received Statin Therapy Members who were dispensed at least on stating medication of any intensity during the measurement year.
 - Statin Adherence 80% Members who remained on a statin medication of any intensity for at least 80% of the treatment period.
- Health Plans must identify members as diabetic by:
 - Claims or encounter data: coded in the measurement year or prior year.
 - Pharmacy data: dispensed insulin or hypoglycemic/antihyperglycemics during the measurement or the prior year.
- A member only needs to be identified by one of the above identifiers to be included in this measure.



What is NCQA's SPD Measure?

- Members may be excluded from this measure; below are some examples of exclusions criteria:
 - Diagnosed with a cardiovascular disease identified in the measurement year or year prior.
 - Pregnancy identified in the measurement year or year prior.
 - Invitro fertilization identified in the measurement year or year prior.
 - ESRD or dialysis identified in the measurement year or year prior.
 - Cirrhosis identified in the measurement year or year prior.
 - Myalgia, myositis, myopathy or rhabdomyolysis identified in the measurement year.
 - Using hospice or using hospice services in the measurement year.
 - Receiving palliative care during the measurement year.
- This measure is only an administrative measure which means that the only way to get credit for this is to submit the appropriate code on a claim.
- Health Partners Plans <u>may not perform</u> medical record review for the AAP measure.



Examples of Best Practices Documentation

- Review member medication profile to confirm current statin therapy and to determine statin use history.
- Educate members on:
 - Importance of staying on the medication.
 - Proper dose, frequency route and timing of the medication.
- Convert member's statin medication to a 90-day supply at mail order or retail pharmacy to boost adherence.
- Schedule proper follow-up with the members to evaluate if medication is taken as prescribed.

Examples of Best Practices Documentation

- If member reports any adverse reactions to their current statin explore the following:
 - Dose reduction
 - Statin medication change
 - Alternate-day dosing.
- Review missing pharmacy refills to ensure members are getting timely refills and make sure prescription instructions are up to date.
- Integrate statin therapy evaluation into every encounter with a diabetic member.
- Code to the highest specificity using guidelines.
